ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY INSTRUCTIONS

Screen Magnifier – Skills Floor Computers

- 1. Username: RR-(location)-Narrator (example: RR-BR-Narrator)
- 2. Password: Customer1
- 3. Once logged in under these credentials you have access to the Screen Magnifier
- 4. Double click on Screen Magnifier and adjust magnification, it will now be on and usable to read anything displayed on the computer screen.

Assistive Listening System - Sound PKT D1 EH Pocketalker

- 1. Place lanyard around your neck.
- 2. Turn on Pocketalker with the volume wheel but don't turn all the way up.
- 3. Plug in disposable earbuds and insert in ears.
- 4. Slowly adjust the volume up until it is a comfortable volume.
- 5. The tone wheel can be adjusted to clear up the sound.

Text-to-Speech Device – C-Pen

- 1. Optionally, you can plug in disposable earbuds and place earbuds in your ears.
- 2. Press the on button
- 3. Hold at a slight angle until the light comes on and move across text
- 4. Lift device and the pen will read the scanned text out loud
- 5. Press the middle button to repeat the line of text
- 6. When done, hold power button and follow instructions to power off.

Screen Reader – Skills Floor Computers

- 1. Username: RR-(location)-Narrator (example: RR-BR-Narrator)
- 2. Password: Customer1
- 3. Once logged in you have access to the Screen Reader (NVDA)

1. Browse Mode: Browse mode is used when reading documents or webpages.

- 2. Focus Mode: Focus mode is used when the user enters a form or other fields that require user input.
- 3. NDVA automatically switches between the modes, but the user can toggle them by using Insert + Space Bar.
- 4. Turn on Speech Viewer: enabling Speech Viewer opens a window that shows everything NDVA states. This is useful for sighted users learning NVDA for testing purposes. Enable it under Tools in the NDVA Menu

*Note these shortcut keys are for NVDA's desktop keyboard layout settings, some shortcuts are different when using NDVA's laptop keyboard layout setting.

MVWA PARTNER REFERRAL FORM

The following is a brief explanation of how to use the Microsoft form referral system for the Mississippi Valley Workforce Area.

One of the most important parts of improving the integration and communication among our partners is to have a simple and effective system for making interagency referrals. We are introducing a Microsoft form to input all of the details for a referral and then send it off to the appropriate contact in our partner agencies. If you ever have a question about the form or the process, please do not hesitate to contact the One Stop Operator with any questions or concerns that you have.

To use this form, you do not need to have an Outlook address, or access to Teams. All you have to do is keep the referral form hyperlink (below) bookmarked on your computer so that it's readily available for whenever you need to make a referral to another partner agency.

Form Instructions

The first fields you come to will collect the personal details and contact information for the customer; these items will give the recipient of the referral the information they will need to reach out to the customer. Any question with an asterisk is a required field. (First name, last name, DOB, gender, email, phone, are all required fields; address and preferred method of communication are not required. If a customer doesn't have email, enter something like none@none.com as a placeholder).

When you click submit, you may be asked to complete a "Captcha" verification. Once you do, you will see a page that indicates your response has been recorded. The designated person (for instance in our first example we chose SCC AEL so it would be Martha Bell) will receive an email notification of the referral, you will receive a notification, and the client will also receive a notification.

On the backside of this system sits a spreadsheet into which all referrals flow. It will be the OSO's job to monitor and maintain the spreadsheet and ensure that referrals are given appropriate follow-up.
