## **CONSENT AGENDA**

The consent agenda included approval of the agenda and approval of previous meeting minutes. Sokolovich made a motion to approve the consent agenda, seconded by Matheson, motion carried.

# YOUTH BUILDING SYSTEM ACADEMY

Krista Tedrow presented a broad overview of their area's participation in Youth Building System Academy; she shared a PowerPoint that will be sent out for the committee to review. South Central involved youth in the process along with community-based organizations, both youths spoke about their perspectives and how they were allowed to participate. Their focus right now is Wapello County. The youths advised they learned about positions they did not know existed and they learned that they were surprised at how passionate the community is about this topic.

### **EOUUS JUNE YOUTH REPORT**

Schaapveld reported 13 out-of-school youth enrollments and 2 in-school youth enrollments for June and 2 entered into Occupational Skills Training. 29 stipends and 35 incentives were paid out in June. Schaapveld also reported outcomes for June: 2 CNA, 1 CDL, 1 Phlebotomy Tech, 1 HiSED, and 7 unsubsidized employments. The customer satisfaction survey was 93.96% in June. Schaapveld presented four participant highlights which all were involved with small businesses.

### VIRTUAL REALITY METRICS REPORT

Schaapveld stated they had 31 unique users this month. 59 Sims started with 27 completed. 2 youths started in the Virtual Training Facility and completed 14 simulations. Schaapveld advised they have the new VR headsets and towards the end of the month, the new healthcare suite has been uploaded. Nye advised it will help even with basic life skills for culinary skills or healthcare CPR.







The participant stayed in contact with the Navigator and through some effort and referring the participant and his family to a family therapist he was able to come home. One of the motivational tools we used was our program and what he could learn and new skills he could acquire. We were able to get this young man a WEP at Tri-city electric. He did his VR hours and worked really hard to complete his modules. The participant received his first review from Tri city electric and as follows


"Good afternoon Jamie



# Career Exploration: Unique Users by Month




# Career Exploration: Sims Started by Month




# Career Exploration: Sims Started by Occupation




# Career Exploration: Started in Last 30 Days by Day








# Virtual Training Facility: Unique Users Per Month by Class




# Virtual Training Facility: Completed Sims by Class with Sim Detail




# Virtual Training Facility: Completed Sims by Month



# Virtual Training Facility - Sims by Module with Mastery Detail




# Virtual Training Facility - Sims by Class with Mastery Detail
